Entered service 6/4/1942 in Milwaukee and discharged 1/7/1946 at Ft Sheridan, IL.

He was a field linesman with the 641st Field Artillery, having trained at Ft Sill, OK for mule pack artillery, glider field artillery. Served at Ft Sill, Ft Bragg (Battery A 215th FA Battalion) Allan AFB, Camp McCall, England, Austria.

He was in European Theatre of Operations at the battles of Ardennes, Rhineland, and Central Europe, and was in the Battle of the Bulge.

His medals include Victory, American Theatre, European-African-Middle Eastern with three bronze stars, and two overseas, one service stripe, and Good Conduct. He joined American Legion Post in 1948 and was active member until he died 61 years after joining. His wife was Ann, and he had two brothers Jim and Alvin and five or six sisters.
