Entered service 12/2/1942 Milwaukee. Discharged 1/3/1946 Camp McCoy, WI.

Was in HQ battery 181st field artillery batallion. Spent some time encamped at Ft. Sheridan, IL, Camp Roberts, and Camp Stoneman.

Battles included New Guinea, Southern Philippines, Aitape, Lingyan in New Guinea and Luzon Gulf and Mindanao in the Philippines. He contracted malaria, and had to undergo treatments from 1946 to 1948.

Sailed from Oakland, CA on *SS Monticello*, arriving Sidney 11/10/1943, and went to camp in Brisbane.

Medals include Good Conduct and the Bronze Arrowhead.

He married Mildred Koebel on August 1, 1946, but had a very bad case of asthma and died. She later married Dewey Jacobsen. Paul Goodman's parents were Thorliefur (Tom) Goodman and Amalie (Lena) K. Hansen. He had a brother and two sisters, and also had a daughter Ruth. Goodman was a shortened form of the native Goodmander.
