His family were summer residents from Sheboygan from 1917 when Clarence was six years old. Shortly after his residency in Detroit he entered service as a Second Lieutenant Medical Officer from 1944 to 1945 in the European theater of operations. Initially he served on a hospital ship, and later on a hospital train. His ship followed the North African invasion, then the Italian campaign, and finally the invasion of France. He was awaiting transfer to the Pacific theater after VE day in April, 1945, when the war ended that August. He was honorably discharged as Captain later in 1945. He talked about the destruction and poverty in Europe, and of the gratefulness of the people he met.

Lived in Jensenville in the Hans Mueller family home. Hans had invented electric welding. He had married Hedrig Hansen. He was the father of Liz, former wife of Dewey Jacobsen, and later of Sidney Holmes, also buried on the Island.

In service he spent some time at Carlisle Barracks, PA. Then he was sent to a 1700 bed hospital in North Carolina where he cared for wounded soldiers. Later, he had a medical practice in Illinois.
